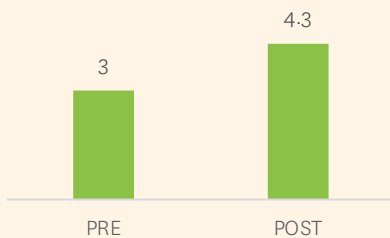

Since the pilot in Southwark & Merton (2020-2021), we have offered our Social Prescribing of Arts & Culture Workforce Development Programme across several boroughs in London, including Croydon (2022), Hackney (2022), Enfield (2023), Brent (2023) and Newham (2023).

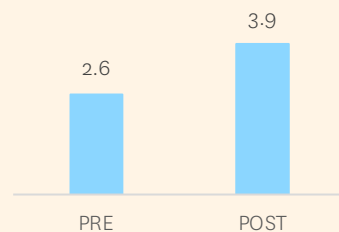
Across the boroughs we have worked with **175** individuals (129 Artists, 46 Social Prescribers).

We found increases across all knowledge and confidence measures, including...

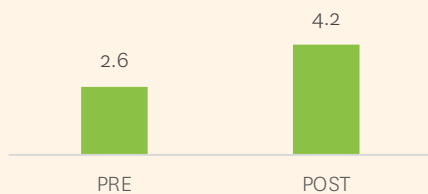

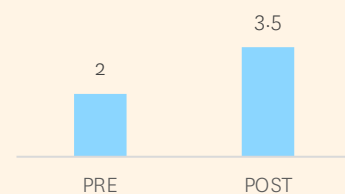
The role of a social prescriber/link worker
